

THE COURT OF QUÉBEC'S ACTION AND RECONCILIATION PLAN NATIVE MATTERS

- 1- **DECLARE** to judges, presiding justices of the peace and all partners that justice services rendered by the Itinerant Court on the territory of Eeyou Istchee James Bay (Cree Nation), Nunavik (Inuit Nation) and the North Shore (Innu and Naskapi Nations) are now the responsibility of the entire Court of Québec, and not a local or regional responsibility.
- 2- **PUBLISH** the following statements outlining the Court of Québec's orientations with regard to the Itinerant Court
 - Declaration of the Court of Québec to the First Nations and Inuit
 - Declaration of the Court of Québec for judges and justices of the peace.
- 3- **LAUNCH** a consultation with First Nations and Inuit to examine the judicial services provided by the Court of Québec to them, in order to better meet their needs.
- 4- **REQUEST** the creation of a position of Associate Chief Judge responsible for justice with First Nations and Inuit and, in the meantime, **DESIGNATE** a judge responsible for coordinating the implementation of the Court of Québec's new orientations in this regard.
- 5- **REQUEST** the opening of existing posts and additional posts dedicated to the Itinerant Court (including Emergency Centralization), with various places of residence for judges and presiding justices of the peace.

- 6- **CREATE** a team of puisne judges and assistant judges to sit on the Itinerant Court.
- 7- **TAKE** the necessary steps to ensure that the Department of Justice provides the North Shore Itinerant Court with a “travel organizer”.
- 8- **ESTABLISH** an induction, mentoring and training program for judges sitting on the Itinerant Court.
- 9- **ADOPT** internal guidelines and policies relating to the operation of the Itinerant Court.
- 10- **DETERMINE** the appropriate structure to manage Itinerant Court assignments.
